

Ancient Roads Special Meeting 5/28/09 at 9:30 am

The purpose of the meeting was to learn from Paul Hannon how to find starting and ending points of roads.

Facts we need to remember:

Brownington Gore lots were 40 acres and Cauldesburge lots were 140 – 160 acres.

Can go to County Records for layout of County Roads.

Set up a series of file folders to document the history of some of the present roads. They may contain pieces of ancient roads, which may have connected them together.

Files may also contain a copy of the deed to show ownership of pieces of road, etc.

Files may also contain a form for positioning of landmarks, etc.

1810 Road #1- we worked and got so far.

1818 Road #2 – 1816 State record – or maybe in County Clerk Office. This is a piece of Meade Hill Road.

1822 Road #3 – 6352.5 feet of road, which goes from Derby to Salem. This is plotable.

1823 Road #4 – Plotable

1823 Road #5 – Done

1824 Road #6 – Turns out to be Hatten Heights Road. Legally town highway 13 and goes to highway 15 so this is a known road.

1824 Road #7 – Plotable – on old map in office.

1824 Road #8 – Distances keep us from plotting (need to find cellar hole)

It was voted to let Paul Hannon go for the today because of cost. We can send him plotable roads that we accept as a committee at a later date.

Allen to get file folders to keep info in about each road researched.

Next meeting to be scheduled for two weeks – 15th of June @ 6 pm.

At that meeting we will prepare our report to submit to the Selectmen and ultimately go to grant people.
