The Old Stone House — To assist in maintaining the Old Stone House and it educational programs. \$650.00 Orleans County Citizens Advocacy — For the purpose of creating and supporting relationships between community volunteers and individuals with developmental disabilities. \$500.00 Umbrella — To support services for victims of domestic assault, sexual violence, providing fresh, local food to area seniors and disabled adults through meals on wheels deliveries. \$500.00 Northwood's Stewardship Center — Offer conservation and educational services throughout the area and is supported through generosity of private individuals, local communities, charitable grants and fee for service contracts.
